Timothy M. Hoffman, MD, is Medical Director of the Heart Transplant and Heart Failure Program at Nationwide Children's Hospital and The Ohio State University College of Medicine in the Division of Cardiology and an assistant professor of Pediatrics. He is also a member of the section of Cardiac Critical Care Medicine. He earned his medical degree at the West Virginia University School of Medicine, where he also completed residency and subsequently served as a chief resident. His postgraduate training included a pediatric cardiology fellowship followed by an additional fellowship in cardiac critical care and thoracic organ transplantation at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Prior to his appointment at Nationwide Children's, he was assistant professor and the section chief/medical director of Thoracic Organ Transplantation, as well as a member of the section of Cardiac Critical Care, at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. Research interests include risk factors for peri-operative arrhythmias, optimal inotropic support after cardiac surgery, mechanical and pharmacological support of the failing myocardium, heart transplantation and acute graft failure after thoracic organ transplantation. He is a reviewer for several journals including the *Journal of Thoracic and Cardiovascular Surgery* and *Pediatric Transplantation*. In addition, he is national co-principal investigator, a steering committee member and primary author for the PRIMACORP multi-center trial (Prophylactic Intravenous Use of Milrinone After Cardiac Surgery Operation in Pediatrics). He also served on the FDA advisory panel for milrinone use in pediatrics. He has been an invited lecturer at grand rounds and symposia across North America. He was listed as one of the Best Doctors in America for 2003-04 and 2005-06.
