Following this training, she completed a three year fellowship at Harvard Medical School/Children’s Hospital, Boston, MA, in Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics with an emphasis on child abuse. Dr. Leder is board certified in Pediatrics and Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics. She assumed her present position as Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine and pediatrician in child abuse program at the Family Development Clinic/Center for Child and Family Advocacy in September 1998.

She has been an invited speaker for the American Academy of Pediatrics, and has published in the areas of addressing child sexual abuse in the primary care setting and a case-based teaching curriculum for child sexual abuse, recognition and management of sexual abuse, as well as book chapters on child sexual abuse.

She has been received as a member of the Ray E. Helfer Society, an honorary society of physicians seeking to provide leadership to enhance the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of child abuse and neglect. This membership comprises only approximately 125 physicians in the U.S. and is an honor for her and for the Center for Child and Family Advocacy.
