Because of her interest in child abuse, Dr. McManus has developed expertise in this area and since 2002, provides clinical care and teaching as an attending physician in the Child Assessment Center at the Center for Child and Family Advocacy.

Dr. McManus’ academic accomplishments have focused on pediatric emergency care. She was awarded the Grant Morrow Science Award in 2002. She provides lectures on Physical Child Abuse and Introduction to Clinical Medicine; Problem Based Learning Mentor, Forensic Evidence Collection Lecture and Pediatric Case Reviews. She is an active participant in the strategic planning of the Center for Child and Family Advocacy, and has been instrumental in assisting with the integration of child abuse services between the emergency department and Child Assessment Center at Columbus Children’s. She also provides leadership in the development of the SANE Program at Columbus Children’s.
