SPECIALIZED TREATMENT FOR SEXUAL ABUSE ISSUES

The Center for Child and Family Advocacy's Family Support Program, provided by Nationwide Children's Hospital Behavioral Health Services, offers group, individual and family counseling for child and adolescent sexual abuse victims and their non-offending caregivers in an office setting. Groups run for approximately ten weeks.

The Family Support Program also provides individual and family counseling in the family's home and in communities where families live. These services include crisis support and team collaboration.

Group Treatment

- 3-18 year old Victim Trauma Treatment Groups
- Open Support Group
- Non-offending Caregiver Group associated with specific Victim Trauma Treatment Groups

Individual Treatment

- Victim Trauma
- Non-abused Sibling
- Parental Support and Guidance
- Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing
- Community Support Program

Family Treatment

- Family Therapy and Community Support Program Around Sexual Abuse Related Issues
- Reunification Therapy Following Specific Victim Therapies

Outpatient Treatment for Sexual Abuse Issues

Treatment Staff – Our treatment staff consists of experienced, masters-level therapists with specific training in sexual abuse issues.

Referrals – Referrals for any of the services described can be made by calling (614) 722-8212, Monday through Friday during normal business hours and requesting the Family Support Program Intake Coordinator. Referrals are accepted on an ongoing basis.

Fees – Victim trauma group rates are reduced due to a grant from the Ohio Attorney General's, Victims of Crime Act. Cost for services is based on a sliding fee scale. Medicaid and third party reimbursements are accepted.
