## Facts you should know about childhood cancer:

- ☐ One in every 330 children in Ohio will develop cancer before the age of 19
- ☐ 75% of them will be cancerfree five years after their diagnosis
- ☐ The tumor bank at Children's is one of the few federally funded centers of its kind for pediatric cancer.

At just four years old, Isabel Coupland has been through surgery, chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant to treat an aggressive form of cancer. Cells from the tumor found in her adrenal gland, along with those from thousands of other pediatric patients, are stored at Columbus Children's Research Institute on the campus of Columbus Children's Hospital as part of an international tissue bank, the largest of its kind in the world.

No matter what type of cancer is found in young patients like Isabel, access to this tissue bank allows doctors everywhere, including right here in Central Ohio, to customize treatments and provide the most promising outcomes for every patient.
