Equipment needed:
Mortar and pestle, graduated cylinder, stirring rod

Auxiliary labeling/Storage: Shake Well; Refrigerate (preferred) or Room Temperature

Directions:

1. Crush tablets and triturate to a fine powder in mortar and pestle.
2. Add minimal portion of vehicle and mix to form a viscous, but smooth and uniform paste.
3. Continue adding vehicle geometrically until almost the final volume, mixing well.
4. Transfer contents to calibrated bottle or conical.
5. QS to final volume with vehicle. Stir well.

Final Product Description: White, thick, opaque suspension. Maraschino cherry odor.
