The Center for Child and Family Advocacy (CCFA) is a partnership between Nationwide Children's Hospital and the Columbus Coalition Against Family Violence. CCFA's mission is to foster a safe community by breaking the cycle of violence through coordinated, comprehensive services in treatment and prevention of child abuse and domestic violence. As a national leader in this important work, a multidisciplinary staff of more than 100 professionals has partnered to work together to address the complex issue of family violence providing a service delivery spanning the full spectrum from assessment and investigation, trauma-focused treatment, and prevention including outreach, education and evidence-based models of home visitation.

Evaluation and management of all types of child maltreatment are provided in the outpatient and inpatient clinical settings. Forensic interviews, colposcope guided medical evaluations, mental health assessment and treatment are the key components to the clinical services provided in the Child Assessment Center and Family Support Program – the trauma-focused treatment program. CCFA staff provides educational programs for medical and nursing students, residents and faculty locally, nationally and internationally. The fellowship training program in child abuse pediatrics provides further academic

subspecialty training to physicians interested in child abuse pediatrics. Research highlights for 2007 include: evaluation of the emotional response to the examination of suspected sexual abuse; testing the use of nucleic acid amplification testing of sexually transmitted infections; evaluation and legal outcomes of forensic evidence collection in suspected sexual assaults; development of an intervention for intimate partner violence (IPV) in the context of nurse home visits; and, use of telephone care management as a strategy to prevent further IPV.

Clinical, Teaching and Research Interests

Philip V. Scribano, DO, MSCE, is Medical Director of the Center for Child and Family Advocacy at Nationwide Children's Hospital, Chief of the Division of Child and Family Advocacy and an Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics of The Ohio State University College of Medicine. His professional interests are in health services utilization of maltreated children, psychosocial aspects of family violence and prevention strategies using home visitation. He is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics Sections on Child Abuse and Neglect and Adoption and Foster Care, Chair of the Ohio American Academy of Pediatrics Committee on Child Abuse and Neglect, member and Co-Chair of the Child Abuse Pediatrics Program Directors Committee of the Ray E. Helfer Society, and he serves on the board of the Academy on Violence and Abuse.

Jonathan D. Thackeray, MD, is Clinical Director of the Child Assessment Center at the Center for Child and Family Advocacy at Nationwide Children's Hospital and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. He joined the faculty of the Center for Child and Family Advocacy in 2005 and was appointed to Clinical Director of the Center in 2007. Dr. Thackeray is active in the American Academy of Pediatrics' Section on Child Abuse and Neglect and serves as editor of the section's newsletter. He is President of the Ohio Chapter of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children, a Scholar Member of the Ray E. Helfer Society and a member of the Ambulatory Pediatric Association. His professional interests include intimate partner violence and resident education.

M. Ranee Leder, MD, is an attending physician for the Center for Child and Family Advocacy at Nationwide Children's Hospital and an Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. She is a member of the Division of Child and Family Advocacy. Her clinical interests include child sexual and physical abuse,

particularly the education of professionals, medical and otherwise, on these topics. Her professional interests include resident education and primary care competency of the anogenital examination, as well as use of newer, more sensitive methods for detecting sexually transmitted infections in abuse survivors.

Ellen M. McManus, MD, is an attending physician for the Center for Child and Family Advocacy and Emergency Department at Nationwide Children's Hospital and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. She is a member of the Division of Emergency Medicine at Nationwide Children's Hospital. Because of her clinical interest in child abuse, Dr. McManus has assisted in the development of the acute sexual assault child abuse services in the Emergency Department.
