### Clinical, Teaching and Research Interests

**Keith Owen Yeates, PhD, ABPP/CN**, is Director of the Division of Pediatric Psychology and Neuropsychology at Nationwide Children's Hospital, Director of the Center for Biobehavioral Health at The Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital and Professor of Pediatrics, Psychology and Psychiatry at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. His clinical responsibilities include inpatient and outpatient neuropsychological assessment services,

primarily via clinical supervision in the Pediatric Neuropsychology program. His research focuses on the outcomes of childhood brain disorders, especially traumatic brain injury.

**Anthony Alioto, PhD**, is a psychologist in the Pediatric Psychology program and Associate Director of the Pediatric Psychology Internship Training Program at Nationwide Children's Hospital and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. He provides consultation/liaison services to the Gastroenterology service, specifically to the motility team; outpatient therapy and evaluation; and psychological evaluations for children undergoing renal transplants. His research focuses on patients seen in the Bowel Management Clinic.

**Robert Arendt, PhD**, is a psychologist in the Developmental Assessment Program at Nationwide Children's Hospital and an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine.

**Amy Baughcum, PhD**, is a psychologist in the Pediatric Psychology program at Nationwide Children's Hospital and an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. She provides consultation and liaison services to oncology, neonatal intensive care unit, diabetes and complex care teams. Dr. Butz provides services through the Burn Team, Rheumatology, Headache/Neurology and Cardiology sections and conducts psychoeducational testing. Her research focuses on the use of virtual reality during burn dressing changes, the impact of chronic daily headache on emotional functioning, and anxiety in primary caregivers of patients with congenital heart defect.

**Jennifer E. Cass, PhD**, is the Clinical Director of Pediatric Neuropsychology at Nationwide Children's Hospital and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. She provides consultation to the Late Effects Brain Tumor Clinic and the Cochlear Implant Team, as well as outpatient neuropsychological evaluations. Her research focuses on web-based intervention for adolescents with traumatic brain injury and anticonvulsant treatment of epilepsy.
