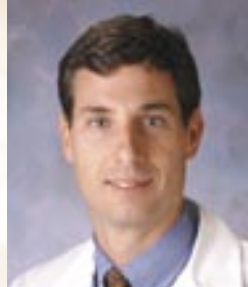


Lung & Heart-Lung Transplant Program Surgical Director

Mark Galantowicz, MD is the surgical director of the Lung, Heart, and Heart-Lung Transplant Programs at the Columbus Children's Hospital. He is also the co-director of Columbus Children's Heart Center, chief of the Department of Cardiothoracic Surgery at Children's, and an associate professor of Surgery at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. After receiving his undergraduate degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he was awarded the Fulbright Scholarship to conduct molecular biology research at the University of Geneva, Switzerland. He received his medical degree from Cornell University Medical College and completed his surgical training, including a fellowship in Cardiothoracic Surgery, at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center. His clinical interests are in the areas of cardiopulmonary transplantation and the surgical repair of newborns with heart disease. His research interests focus on the development of innovative, less-invasive strategies for the management of cardiopulmonary disease.
