

Respiratory Therapy Units

At Nationwide Children's Hospital, our respiratory therapists choose an area of specialized focus in their work. No matter the setting, our respiratory therapists work as One Team to provide top-notch care to patients and their families; using therapist-driven protocols and multidisciplinary teamwork to ensure the best outcomes for patients of all ages.

Cardiac Respiratory Therapy

Respiratory therapists on this team work in the Cardiothoracic ICU and inpatient Cardiology units and specialize in pre- and post-operative cardiac care for patients, ranging from neonates to adults.

- 44 beds across CTICU and inpatient Cardiology
- Treat a wide spectrum of patients with congenital heart defects, acquired heart disease, lung and heart transplants, and patients requiring mechanical circulatory support.

NICU Respiratory Therapy

Respiratory therapists on this team work in the NICU, and in collaboration with the Fetal Medicine Center, to provide advanced respiratory treatment modalities for patients. Respiratory therapists in the NICU care for a range of patients, from neonates with extreme prematurity, to patients up to 3 years old, and support high risk deliveries that occur at Nationwide Children's Hospital.

- 130 bed intensive care unit
- Strong focus on treatment of patients with neurodevelopmental disorders, congenital birth defects, and bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD)

PICU Respiratory Therapy

Respiratory therapists on this team work in two pediatric intensive care units to provide advanced respiratory treatment modalities for critically ill patients with a wide variety of conditions; including burns and traumas, respiratory failure, liver and kidney transplants, and other complex illness, as well as patients with tracheostomies and need for long-term mechanical ventilation.

- 54 beds across two ICUs
- Treat a wide spectrum of patients of all ages with congenital and acquired illness, in need of short or long-term respiratory support in an ICU setting.

Pulmonary Respiratory Therapy

Respiratory therapists on this team work on the H8A Pulmonary inpatient floor to provide respiratory care to patients with respiratory illness, as well as patients with complex medical needs.

- 24 bed unit
- Strong focus on treatment of patients with cystic fibrosis, asthma, bronchiolitis, and patients with tracheostomies.

Respiratory Care CORE

Respiratory therapists on this team work in the Emergency Department, inpatient rehab, the OR and PACU, as well as a variety of inpatient floors.

- Main campus ED, Lewis Center ED, PACU, OR and Cath Lab, and inpatient floors
- Treat a wide spectrum of patients of all ages and acuity, from critical patients in our level 1 trauma center, to patients with asthma, post-surgical patients, and patients recovering from illness or injury in the inpatient rehab unit.

Respiratory Care Scholarship

Each year, Nationwide Children’s Hospital offers three \$4,000 scholarships to provide support to Respiratory Therapy students who have a strong desire to provide care in a pediatric setting.

Respiratory Therapy Residency Program

Nationwide Children's Hospital welcomes new graduates and experienced Respiratory Therapists who are new to pediatrics to our Respiratory Therapy (RT) Residency Program. Our RT program integrates respiratory therapists into the culture and values of Nationwide Children's. It was developed on the belief that creating a safe place to learn facilitates a sense of community and belonging.

This program provides an individualized, precepted orientation, guided classroom learning and peer support sessions. In addition to the hospital and unit/area-based orientations, our RT residency team will provide educational experiences and hands-on practice with skills and simulation.

RT Residency can help you feel more empowered and increase your career satisfaction by:

- increasing confidence, competence and critical thinking skills
- strengthening communication and organizational skills
- facilitating interprofessional relationships
- improving patient care outcome knowledge

Quarterly Curriculum Overview

- First Quarter
 - Introduction to the program components and participant expectations
 - Curriculum focused on our "One Team" hospital culture through discussion and hands on activities related to communication, teamwork and professionalism.
- Second and Third Quarters
 - Six months focused on learning opportunities and topics designed to work towards the mission, vision and values of Nationwide Children's Hospital
- Fourth Quarter
 - Curriculum focused on professional growth and wellness
 - Graduation celebration at the end of the program

Qualifications:

- New graduate RTs who have received RCP licensure within the last 12 months or respiratory therapists new to working in pediatrics
- Received approval from unit leader(s)
- Agreement to attend and actively participate in the six, monthly four-hour seminars







There are over 100 restaurants within walking distance of downtown, not to mention countless others. Craft brewing has exploded in this area over the last decade. Our city is home to over 50 craft breweries, several of which are close enough for people to enjoy walking the Columbus Ale Trail for a day of taste testing.

The Short North

Known as "The Art and Soul of Columbus," this stretch of High Street is a mainstay of over 300 restaurants, bars, art galleries, businesses and entertainment.



The Great Outdoors

There are 19 Metro Parks in Central Ohio, featuring over 230 miles of trails and over 27,000 acres of nature to enjoy. The Scioto River runs through the city, perfect for kayaking. The city has well cared for trails for avid bicyclists and is the starting base for Pelotonia – an annual two-day fundraising bicycle tour that raises money for cancer research. Columbus is about an hour from Hocking Hills State Park which has beautiful trails and offers vacation rentals for a relaxing getaway.

Festivals

Columbus hosts the largest Pride parade and festival in the Midwest, rivalling that of Chicago's. With our diverse population, there is a cultural festival nearly every weekend. We are home to The Arnold Sports Festival, the Columbus Arts festival, and several Jazz & Rib festivals. If you love Halloween, you will love High Ball, the yearly costumed festival in the Short North.



Entertainment

Broadway Columbus hosts national Broadway tours so you will not miss out on the next "Hamilton." The Columbus Museum of Art houses works by the likes of Picasso but also hosts special exhibitions and events regularly. The Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens houses over 400 plant species as well as artwork by Dale Chihuly.
