Nationwide Children's Hospital Respiratory Care Scholarship Program





The Respiratory Care Scholarship Program is made possible by Nationwide Children's Hospital. The goal of this scholarship program is to provide support to Respiratory Therapy (RT) students that have a strong desire to provide care in a pediatric setting.

Criteria for the RT scholarship include academic excellence, service to Nationwide Children's, education and career goals, personal statement, interview, and letters of recommendation. Priority is given to employees of Nationwide Children's, and those actively pursuing a four-year degree in respiratory care. Employees who are considered to be underrepresented minorities are strongly encouraged to apply. Recipients may only receive this award once.

The Nationwide Children's Respiratory Care Scholarship has a formal and competitive application process; applications are reviewed by a committee of hospital personnel. Candidates are selected based on the merits of their application, personal statement, academic performance, resume and letters of recommendation.



Recipients of scholarship funds must commit to working at Nationwide Children's, at the Registered Respiratory Therapy (RRT) level, for one year following graduation and obtaining RRT status. If a scholarship recipient is unable to fulfill this commitment, scholarship funds received must be repaid to Nationwide Children's.

Application Submission

Applicants must submit all application materials to Indya Sims, Clinical Talent Acquisition by **October 19, 2021.** A maximum of three \$2,000 scholarships will be awarded. Scholarship awards may be subject to applicable employment taxes.

Eligible applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

• Acceptance into an Associate or Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care program at a CoARC-accredited college or university.

AND

- Be currently enrolled in a Respiratory Care program and graduating within 12 months
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale. (Official transcripts required)
- Current Nationwide Children's employee applicants must be in good standing and have a positive reference from his/her current supervisor

All applicants must have at least two positive references from clinical instructors and/or an advisor.
