## Board Eligible Periods and Transition Dates for ABMS Member Boards



The ABMS Board Eligibility Policy, which became effective January 1, 2012, limits the period of time that may elapse between a physician's completion of training and achievement of initial certification in a specialty. In implementing this policy, those ABMS Member Boards that did not have an existing Board Eligibility Policy in place were to establish a Board Eligible Period of three (3) to seven (7) years for candidates to achieve initial certification following the successful completion of accredited training, and in accordance with the corresponding Member Board requirements, plus time (if any) in practice required by the Member Board for admissibility to the certifying examination. A Member Board with an already existing Board Eligibility Policy was to ensure that its Board Eligible Period aligned with the principles of the established ABMS Board Eligibility Policy, but each such Member Board's transition dates could vary.
