Patients Benefit from our Communication and Coordination of Care

"Why can't these doctors just talk to each other so he doesn't have to get poked every week for labs?" When asked to write an article about physician communication, my mother's rhetorical questioning of the missing interaction between my father's primary care and specialist physicians was my immediate thought. Her frustration was not unique nor was it unwarranted, particularly when a quick phone call between these two doctors has simplified the treatment plan.

Related, I wonder how often busy physicians skip to the bottom of a PCP's encounter note or specialist's referral letter to only read the treatment plan. Unfortunately, in both instances, electronic medical records have allowed these communication devices to become bloated with superfluous details and minimal substance. As billing checklists are marked off and the Control-V paste function gets overused, physicianto-physician information exchange is lost as quickly as a fax machine runs out of paper. Thankfully, Nationwide Children's Hospital has made efforts to strengthen communication between outpatient physicians and the hospital staff.

Potential Benefits of Routinely Administering HPV Vaccine at Age 9

Administering the human papillomavirus vaccine earlier is not only feasible but appears to provide benefits, a quality improvement (QI) study at Nationwide Children's shows. QI interventions increased the percentage of patients of patients under age 11 receiving the vaccine to 60.8 percent while the national average for adolescents remains below 50 percent. Earlier administration eliminates the perceived need to discuss sexuality and focuses on cancer prevention. The vaccine, which prevents at least six different cancers caused by HPV infection, also elicits a more robust immune response in younger children. To learn more, visit **PediatricsNationwide.org.**

Racial Disparities in Suicide Rates by Age

Suicides recently made headlines, from celebrity deaths to a report showing the national suicide rate has increased by 30 percent in the last two decades. At the same time, investigators in the Center for Suicide Prevention and Research at nationwide Children's released a study in *JAMA Pediatrics* showing suicide rates for black children aged 5-12 are about twice that for white children the same age. The finding is a surprise and counters the long-held perception that suicide among whites is uniformly higher that among blacks. Studies such as this one reveal vulnerable subgroups and can lead to targeted prevention efforts, says Jeff Bridge, PhD, center director and lead author of the study. Remembering Annemarie Sommer, MD

Dr. Annemarie Sommer was born in 1932 and raised in Konigsberg, Germany. Her family had to flee to other parts of Germany during the Russian occupation of the Baltic Sea after World War II. She escaped from East Germany and immigrated to the U.S. in the 1950's where she worked in New York and earned a general education diploma so she could attend college. She received her undergraduate degree at Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, in 1960, working her way through school. She was accepted at The Ohio State University Medical School and became interested in genetics during her training. She was board certified in Pediatrics and Genetics and worked her entire career at Nationwide Children's Hospital. She described her role as "the detective," who diagnosed genetic conditions in children and helped families understand the effects of the diagnosis. A longtime resident of Dublin, Ohio, Dr. Sommer served as chief of Genetics at Nationwide Children's for many years. She presented papers on genetics at numerous conferences and meetings during her career and her reputation is known internationally. She loved nature and the outdoors and was an avid swimmer and photographer. A memorial gathering will be held at the Nature Center at Highbanks MetroPark on Thursday, September 20, 2018 from 4-6 p.m.
