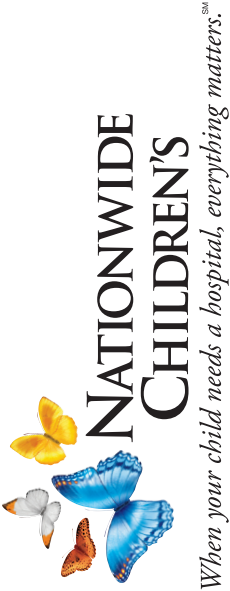

Keynote: Nationally Known Motivational Speaker and Author



Matthew Jones

Matt will share his remarkable journey of conquering cancer three times, to relearning how to walk, to surviving a bone marrow transplant, and going on to complete seven marathons on seven continents! When Matt was a child, he lost his sister to epilepsy and will provide a sibling’s perspective and what he recalls about the hospice care his sister received.

When Matt was diagnosed with cancer on September 11, 2002, it was discovered it had spread to the fluid in his brain. Most doctors treating Matt did not think he would live. At one point, Matt did slip into an unconscious state. However, against all odds, he regained consciousness, and conquered the cancer. From his first step when he was relearning how to walk, Matt visualized completing a marathon. His first marathon was the San Diego Rock N’ Roll. That was soon followed by completing marathons in Rome, Tokyo, Perth, Cape Town, Antarctica, and Chile.

Founder of the R.E.A.L. Leadership Academy, Matt is also an author of more than ten books, including his newest one, “Happiness is a Marathon: 26.2 Ways to Stay Happy at Work and in Life.” Matt’s story of overcoming insurmountable odds is certain to inspire all who attend! You will leave motivated to achieve even greater personal goals and continued best outcomes for patients, and their families.
