# Synagis Dosing Ends Early and Medicaid Patient Eligibility

As predicted, the dosing of Synagis for RSV Season 2022-2023 ended at Nationwide Children's on January 30, with the last inhome dosing completed on February 3. Per Dr. Pablo Sanchez's letter to providers, "The RSV season in Ohio continues to be extremely unusual with September 12, 2022, being the start of the RSV season in Columbus. We at Nationwide Children's Hospital follow the weekly RSV positivity rates performed in the Clinical Microbiology Laboratory. Since January 14, 2023, the RSV positivity rates have remained less than 10%, the most recent being 6% on January 28, 2023. Therefore, we can now declare that this past year's RSV season in Columbus has ended, and prophylaxis with Palivizumab (Synagis) is no longer indicated or needed." Dr. Sanchez and his staff will continue to monitor RSV positivity. They will inform providers when it is time to initiate prophylaxis for the 2023-2024 RSV season.

Medicaid eligibility is a major plank in Homecare's Vision statement - To be the premier home care and hospice program, recognized for its excellence in quality, evidence-based care, research and equitable access. This vision means little without equitable access to the premier programs. Homecare supports Partners For Kids efforts in spreading the word about Medicaid redetermination, which could impact many patients. As providers, we all have a role in keeping eligible patients' Medicaid coverage.

During the public health emergency of the pandemic, redetermination had been suspended. However, that ends in April when the redetermination of benefits will begin. Ohio Department of Medicaid estimates that about 70% of existing Medicaid patients will receive automatic recertification for eligibility. The other 30% will need to take some action to keep their coverage, including approximately 38,000 children in central, south-central and west-central Ohio.

More information to share with patient families, if they have not enrolled recently in another benefit program, such as SNAP, they may be in jeopardy of losing their coverage. For those parents who are unsure, they can call (800) 324-8680 or visit **ss.benefits.ohio.gov** – and tell them to select 'Access my cash, food, medical or child care assistance,' and select – 'Report a Change to My Case.' For support materials, visit **PartnersForKids.org/news-updates/** and open *New Materials to Encourage Patient Update Medicaid Information* window. Nationwide Children's providers can order hot cards through SmartWorks and search 'Medicaid Redetermination' on ANCHOR for additional resources.
