Nationwide Children's is Authorized Treatment Center for Sickle Cell Gene Therapy

Nationwide Children's Hospital has recently been designated an authorized treatment center for CASGEVY™ (exagamglogene autotemcel (exa-cel)), a gene therapy for the treatment of sickle cell disease.

In December 2023, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved CASGEVY, which was developed by pharmaceutical company Vertex Pharmaceuticals and CRISPR Therapeutics, for the treatment of sickle cell disease in adult and pediatric patients 12 years and older who require regular red blood cell transfusions.

With Vertex Pharmaceuticals' designation, Nationwide Children's becomes one of a handful of facilities throughout the United States certified to have the advanced facilities and specially trained staff necessary for the administration of CASGEVY.

CASGEVY is a CRISPR-based gene therapy that edits a patient's own blood stem cells to produce high levels of the healthy, oxygen-carrying hemoglobin that is typically produced in utero. For more information, visit **NationwideChildrens.** org/newsroom.

Ohio Amblyope Registry

The Ohio Amblyope Registry (OAR) is the first and only statewide program in the United States designed to serve the needs of children with amblyopia (commonly known as "Lazy Eye"), their families and eye doctors. It is a voluntary registration program to increase knowledge about amblyopia, its treatment and prevention. The OAR provides free eye patches for the treatment of amblyopia, free literature about amblyopia and its causes, as well as other important services to help families of children with amblyopia. All services are free of charge (restricted to Ohio residents only). The OAR is part of the Save Our Sight program that receives voluntary contributions from the check-off donation box on the Ohio License plate renewal forms.
