Ohio Amblyope Registry

The Ohio Amblyope Registry (OAR) serves the needs of children with amblyopia, commonly known as "lazy eye," their families and eye care providers. The OAR provides free eye patches (adhesive or cloth), educational material, compliance material and literature about amblyopia. The patches provided are latex-free and hypoallergenic. All services provided by the registry are free to any amblyope child who resides in Ohio up to 18 years of age. The OAR is funded through generous donations from Ohioans when they renew their license plates via the Save Our Sight Fund.

Homecare's Intermittent Skilled Nursing (ISN) team has expanded its service area in central Ohio, while continuing to provide care in the Toledo region. Home Medical Equipment (HME) continues to deliver equipment and supplies to all 88 counties, except for phototherapy. Due to regulations, phototherapy equipment is not available in every county.
