HOMECARE UPDATE

Homecare's Phototherapy Program

The Nationwide Children's Hospital Homecare Phototherapy Program is provided through Homecare's HME services. HME technicians inventory and maintain the equipment, as well as provide delivery and setup in patient homes seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. The service area includes nine counties - Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway, Ross and Union. These are the same counties where Nationwide Children's Homecare and Hospice nurses provide services.

Referrals to the Phototherapy Program begin with a phone call to Nationwide Children's Homecare at 614-355-1100, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., where an HME Service Coordinator reviews patient demographics and payor coverage. Once the patient referral is received, the signed physician order can be sent via fax to 614-355-1182. If the physician has access to Nationwide Children's Epic, the referral can be completed there.

The Phototherapy Program has increased the number of phototherapy blankets in stock. However, as most in pediatric health care know, phototherapy referrals often occur in waves. This means, within a couple of days, HME can go from being fully stocked with bili blankets to having none on the shelf. HME requests referring physicians to notify Homecare as soon as a patient is discharged from the bili blanket. An HME technician will pick up the equipment from the family's home, clean and recalibrate, so it is ready to answer the next patient referral.
