# Providers May Now Upload Documents when Requesting Appointments Online

As of December, providers may upload documents when requesting an appointment online. This allows test results to be shared immediately and provides continuity of care through EPIC.

How does it work? Users can drag and drop content or browser on their local machine.

- Users can add more than one document.
- As documents are added, system displays upload progress and size of file.

Users can upload more than one document at a time.

Once documents are uploaded a checkbox next to that item shows up to indicate is has uploaded successfully.

• Maximum file size is 250MB.

If file size is over the maximum, users are presented with an error message indicating file size is too large.

- PDFs, .docx, JPG and PNG files can be uploaded.
- There is a text area for to indicate to the user which file types are supported and what the maximum file size is.

Each of these are their own field that are editable by content authors.

• Uploads will be checked for Macros and Virus detection.

If detected file will not upload and error message will be displayed to the user.

### **HOMECARE UPDATE**

## Homecare Nursing, Therapy and Social Work Documentation in Epic

Homecare and Hospice nursing, therapy and social work patient documentation has been available on Nationwide Children's Epic for more than 90 days. After completing a quarter of online documentation, a big hurdle is timeliness of signed patient care orders and Plan of Cares from medical staff.

Homecare has adopted Nationwide Children's policy practice for patients' orders to be signed within 48 hours. The Plan of Care needs to be signed within seven days. When a referral is made to Homecare, for nursing, skilled therapy, Hospice and other skilled services a Plan of Care, and sometimes, individual orders are sent to the referring/responsible physician's In Basket for review and signature. Signed orders and Plan of Cares are always needed to schedule and provide ongoing patient care, accurately bill insurance and remain Medicaid compliant.

Physicians and staff within Nationwide Children's, or at practices using CareLink, are able to view up to date home visit documentation for Homecare and Hospice nursing, therapy, and social work visits, in addition to sending orders.

**Please note:** Homecare Pharmacy and Home Medical Equipment cannot use Epic. For Pharmacy or HME only referrals, orders and/or follow up will continue via phone, secure fax or eRx from the referring prescriber or staff.

Nationwide Children's Hospital physicians will find additional Homecare Epic information on our Homecare and Hospice - What's New ANCHOR page. We will also have an Epic Homecare fact sheet in the February Medical Staff mailing that will include information related to home health "responsible physician" regulations and NCH Homecare policies.
