
ABIGAIL WEXNER RESEARCH INSTITUTE RESEARCH RETREAT

Last November, our team got the opportunity to present a poster discussing the Mentoring program at the Nationwide Children's Hospital Research Retreat. We decided to look at some of the information we have collected from our previous mentor applicants. We looked at differences in what motivations our applicants had for volunteering and their ability for managing their IBD, based on whether we accepted them into the program, they withdrew from the application process, or if we declined them. We also looked at whether we could use this information to predict which mentors would be the most successful.

We are really excited about the results we found! We are doing a great job at screening our potential mentors. The mentors we accepted into the program managed their disease better than those that we declined. We also found that mentors with better disease management and having more values, career, increasing knowledge, skills and experiences, and personal enhancement motivations for volunteering were all associated with better relationship quality after the one-year relationship!

Our research assistant, Abby, will be traveling to Dallas in March to present this research at another conference!
