Road Safety in Haiti

- Lack of datas (according MoH statistics, 16,7% of 224,216 cases in Emergency Unit for 2013)
- Lack of institutional support
- Lack of road signs and markings
- Speed
- Drunk Driving

Road Safety in Haiti

- Road Surface often in bad condition
- Sidewalks, when existing, are regularly 'abused or in bad condition
- Overloading of vehicles
- Lack of technical control
- Lack of Enforcement

Safe School Zones

 Objective: To minimize the number crashes in the vicinity of schools though systemic interventions that include actions on the environment, the education, the school administration and the surrounding communities.

Safe School Zones: Selecting schools

- School Location: Schools which are located along major and heavy traffic roads and which are more vulnerable to traffic crashes
- Number of Students: Schools with a large number of students are prioritized
- Commitment: An evaluation of the will and commitment is organized through observation and discussion with the school principal, as well as school employees and teachers

Safe School Zones: Environment

- Safety Audit
- Traffic signs installation: Speed limit, Slow down, Children crossing etc.
- Pedestrians crossing
- Cross side walk
- Safe pick up area and waiting area
- Mapping safe road to school

Safe School Zones: Education

- Include Road Safety within national curricula's
- Develop age appropriate pedagogical materials
- Trainings of Teachers
- Propose pedagogical visits (police, hospital,..), testimonies (victims/ offenders) and practical trainings (visibility, bike repairs, ...)
- Encouraging volunteers for peers education
- Road Safety Contest : drama, songs, drawings

Safe School Zones: School management

- Build a Safe School zone team composed of one teacher and a group of 4 students to organize safe exit
- Include safety elements in the internal rules : helmet, licence, visibility, ...and penalities!
- Road Safety code of conduct for teachers ensuring they play a role model
- Helmet bank

Safe School Zones: School management



Safe School Zones : Community mobilization

- Community awareness is be conducted in the area surrounding the safe school zone to inform road users to behave safely in the school zone and especially to give priority to pedestrians
- Sessions with parents are organized to raise their awareness in order for them to be a role model and educate their children at home.

Safe School Zones: Monitoring and evaluation

- Pre/post test for teachers and students committee will be carried out
- Pre/post survey will be conducted through interview and observation in selected communes
