
#### Deliver the Child Declaration!

Oh, and take a picture of you delivering the Declaration and share it on social media with hashtag #SaveKidsLives!









Enhancing safety performance and protection for all road users on the 10% of highest risk roads.

We are supporting the work of the non-profit International Road Assessment Programme (iRAP) which works with governments and

development banks rating highways across the world for safety. Improving a road by one iRAP star rating can halve death risk. We want to see the highest risk roads meeting minimum 3 star standards by 2020, entirely eliminating 1-2 star roads globally by 2030.

minimum UN vehicle safety standards, with air bags and electronic stability control (ESC), by 2020.



Delivering safe streets for all, particularly around schools, through low speed zones and improved pedestrian and cyclist facilities.

In partnership with UNICEF we are building coalitions and evidence in several countries to improve safety for children on their journey to and from school, as a foundation for community-wide safe and sustainable mobility. We have a vision that by 2030 every child should be protected on the way to school, with safe walking and cycling routes: good for health, good for our environment.
