Visible Barcodes

When sending specimens with the courier, please place the lab requisition in the outside pouch of the biohazard bag so that the barcode label is facing out. This allows the courier to scan the barcode when picking up the sample. Scanning the barcode for each specimen helps us keep track of your patient's lab samples.

Tighten Your Lids



When submitting urine sample for testing, please secure the container lid tightly. This will prevent leaks in the specimen bag and exposure to biohazard fluids when handling the specimen.

Improper Labeling & Unlabeled Lab Specimens



To ensure that our clients receive the most accurate and timely laboratory results, it is critical that all specimens sent to our lab are accurately labeled with two patient identifiers (First

and Last Name and Date of Birth) along with collection date/time and the collectors initials.

Five rights for specimen labeling:	
 Right Patient 	 Right Test
 Right Label 	 Right Time
Right Tube	



At Nationwide Children's Laboratory Service Centers you can expect exceptionally trained pediatric phlebotomists that will always provide special care and attention to your child. Most hospitals and commercial laboratories use standard straight needles. Our phlebotomists know from experience that butterfly needles are the best choice to use over straight needles

when the patient's veins are small, as is often the case with children and elderly. They are trained to properly choose the correct butterfly needle gauge, practice proper phlebotomy techniques, and follow proper butterfly needle safety protocol.

Advantages to using butterfly needles are:



- 1. It is generally less painful because the butterfly needle is a smaller gauge needle (we use three different gauge sizes).
- 2. Using a butterfly blood collection needle is less likely to collapse the patient's vein which means fewer secondary needle sticks.
- 3. The use of 12" tubing allows the patient to move with some degree of ease without jarring the needle, or the sample container, out of place. This is especially helpful when collecting blood from combative patients.
- 4. The ability to obtain the specimen from the back of the patient hand with a lower risk of nerve damage that is prevalent when using a straight needle.
- 5. For pediatric patients, the 3/4" needle length is less scary to look at than the longer length of straight needles. This can result in better overall patient demeanor and overall experience for the child and their parent.
