



APPOINTMENT OF TEACHING FACULTY

The Program Director administers and maintains a quality GME environment. The Program Director must:

- Oversee and ensure the quality of didactic and clinical education in all sites that participate in the program
- Approve a local director at each participating site who is accountable for resident and fellow (trainee) education
- Approve the selection of program faculty
- Work jointly with the Section Chief to evaluate program faculty and approve the continued participation of program faculty based on evaluation
- Monitor trainee supervision at all participating sites

Teaching staff must demonstrate sound clinical and teaching abilities, commitment to GME, and support of the goals and objectives of the program. The teaching staff must have sufficient background and expertise to ensure that the educational goals, objectives, and/or curricular content of the program can be met.

Physician members of the teaching staff who supervise patient care at Nationwide Children's Hospital (NCH) facilities must be credentialed by the NCH Medical Staff Office. All physician members of the teaching staff must also be privileged for the procedures and clinical activities which they are teaching.

Physician members of the teaching staff who supervise NCH trainees in patient care in other facilities must be credentialed by those institutions and privileged for the clinical activities they are teaching.

The Program Director will identify any other non-physician personnel who will be involved in the teaching program and will ensure satisfactory credentials for each such individual.

If a trainee seeks to participate in a program outside the NCH program assignment, the request must be approved by the Program Director. The Program Director will review the credentials of the preceptor and the proposed program plan to ensure a quality educational experience. An agreement between NCH and the participating program must be in place prior to the participation of the trainee in the program.
